

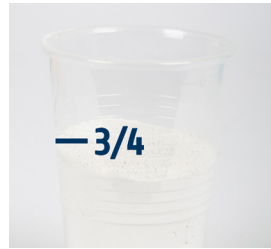


# Craft template: **CHALK**



## What will I need?

- 4 liquid colours
- modelling plaster
- 4 wooden sticks (maybe from the last ice lolly?)
- 4 single-use plastic cups
- 4 shapes (sand moulds or silicone moulds)



**1** Once you've got all the ingredients, you can start!

**2** First, start stirring the plaster using 4 single-use cups, each 3/4 filled with plaster.

**3** Next, add two large drops of liquid colour to each cup, using a different colour for each cup.



**4** Then, steadily add a little bit of water to the mixture until it reaches the consistency of soft-serve ice cream. If the mixture is too thin, you can add a little more plaster.

**5** Next, quickly fill the plaster mixture in the moulds.

**6** The mixture dries very quickly, which is why the moulds should be filled immediately so that the mixture doesn't form clumps.



**7** Now it's time to wait! It's best to let your chalk dry overnight (at least 8 hours) so that it comes out of the moulds easily.

**8** The chalk pieces are now finished and can be used for drawing!

**9** Depending on your children's age, they'll create brightly coloured pictures on the pavement, while younger children will write their first letters and numbers together with you and older children will let off steam playing hopscotch or hangman.

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
